



**Non Formal Education Materials Distribution**  
**Achieving New Frontiers in Sindh's Education Sector**





After the successful development and finalization of NFE learning materials for 30,000 out of school children in Sindh, USAID Sindh Reading Program embarks on a new journey with the distribution of 9,000 textbooks among the initial group of 3,000 learners in Dadu, Jacobabad and Kashmore districts.





The learning materials distributed among 2,226 girls and 774 boys in special ceremonies, attended by a large number of local authorities, community members, partner organizations, children and parents.
